Adagio

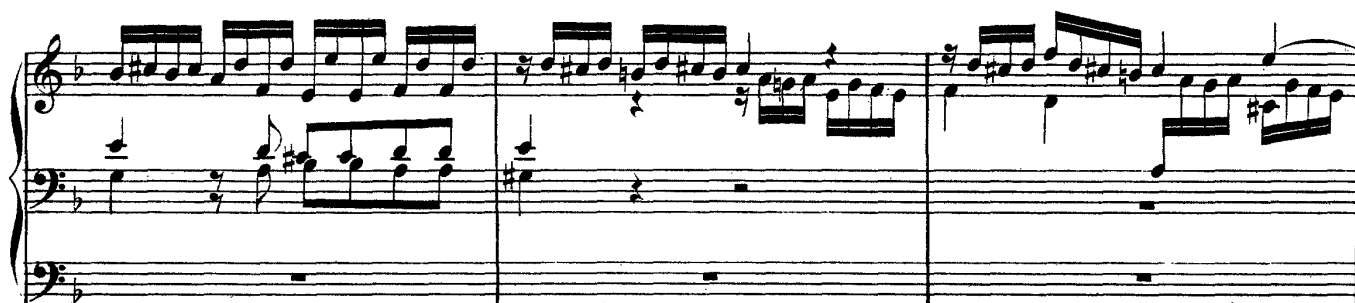
